The Key to College Success? SPC Students Reveal Their Go-To Resources

Students at St. Philip's College benefit from a variety of campus resources that support their academic success. To gain insight into which resources are most impactful, we spoke with several students about their experiences. Here's what we found out:

Tutoring Centers

Patricia Pardo echoed this sentiment, saying, "The library is one of the best resources on campus. It offers everything I need to focus and succeed academically."

"It can save you so much time and stress." Pardo added, "Find a study routine that works for you and make the library part of it—it really makes a difference."

Career Services

Career services also play a crucial role in students' professional development. "Career services have helped me prepare for job applications and interviews," said Julian Castillo. "They offer resume reviews and workshops that have made a big difference in my professional growth."

His advice to new students? "Start using career services early, even if you're not sure about your career path yet," said Castillo. "They can help you explore different opportunities and gain valuable skills for the job market."

Advocacy Services

Advocacy services provide essential support for students facing personal and academic challenges. These services help students access resources for financial assistance, housing, food insecurity, and emotional well-being.

"Advocacy services have been a lifeline for me," said one student. "They helped me find emergency funding when I was struggling, and they connected me with resources I didn't even know existed."

Advice for new students? "If you ever feel overwhelmed, don't be afraid to ask for help," the student added. "There are so many resources on campus designed to support you, and the advocacy center is one of the best places to start." Conclusion
