

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Scholarships usually based on athletic or academic merit, or your field of study.

Grants—funds are usually need-based (for example, based on family income). Federal grants are the most common.

Loans — Federal Loans are the most common and provide the most protection to student consumers. Loans should be a last resort if scholarships or grants are unavailable. Loans must be repaid!
