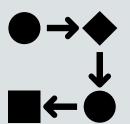
















## What happens if we are not successful in demonstrating compliance?

A finding of Noncompliance in a report written by a visiting committee indicates that an institution has failed to document that it meets a standard in the Principles of Accreditation.

Reports written by both Off-Site Reaffirmation Committees and On-Site (all types) Committees require judgments about the compliance or non-compliance of the institution with all of the standards relevant to the review; each judgment is summarized in a short narrative that details how the institution meets or fails to meet the standard or requirement.

In reports written by visiting committees, narratives that detail findings of non-compliance include recommendations, which formally cite the lack of compliance with a standard or requirement. Denial of Reaffirmation, continued accreditation for a maximum of one year and imposition of a sanction.

A Monitoring Report provides additional documentation of compliance for those standards of the Principles of Accreditation identified by the Committee on Compliance and Reports following review of a committee's findings as issues for which full compliance has not yet been documented.

## Preliminary Report from the Off-Site Reaffirmation Committee

Out of 73 standards/requirements, 11 were found to be non-compliant.

Thank you for the considerable effort of you and your colleagues in preparing your institution's Compliance Certification. The Preliminary Report of the Off-Site Reaffirmation Committee is available for download from the SACSCOC institutional portal.

The report represents the professional judgment of the Off-Site Reaffirmation Committee made in accordance with the *Principles of Accreditation: Foundations for Quality Enhancement*. The preliminary judgments of non-compliance are intended to assist the institution in preparing a Focused Report for review by the On-Site Reaffirmation Committee. In the Focused Report, the institution can provide additional narrative and supporting documentation in support of its case for compliance with each standard cited by the Off-Site Committee. This step is an important opportunity for the institution to clarify and strengthen its documentation of compliance and facilitate the on-site review. The guidelines for the Focused Report and guidance for formatting the document can be found in the *Handbook for Institutions Seeking Reaffirmation* and in *Documents Submitted for SACSCOC Review*. The Focused Report, your QEP, and updated Institutional Summary Form should be uploaded to the institutional portal 42 days prior to the on-site visit. For the specific due date, please refer to the step card in the portal.

Please contact me if you would like to review the Preliminary Report of the Off-Site Reaffirmation Committee together prior to preparing your Focused Report. This consultation also may be helpful to you in planning for the On-Site Reaffirmation Committee's upcoming visit.

An institution may release this preliminary report; however, release of this report in its entirety or in part must be accompanied by the following statement. "The findings of the Off-Site Reaffirmation Committee represent a preliminary assessment of the institution at this time; final action on the report rests with the SACSCOC Board of Trustees." If the institution releases part of its report, that part must contain a note stating: "A copy of the entire report may be obtained from the institution."

The table shows 19 information literacy presentations for fall semester 2023; however, the narrative noted that the numbers in the table do not represent the total number of sessions taught. The Off-Site Reaffirmation Committee could not find evidence showing the full number of presentations. Similarly, while the Committee reviewed screenshots of the library's web pages and pages in Canvas showing that reference services and research guides are available, the Committee could not find information about the research guides provided. The institution's library provides formal instruction to classes and informal instruction to individuals through reference services and research guides. The Off-Site Reaffirmation Committee could not, however, find evidence of how often instruction takes place to determine whether instruction is regular and timely.	number of presentations in 2023 and 2024

The institution also reports that there is an agreement between the institution and an outsourced service to process academic transcripts and a collaborative/consortia agreement between the five Alamo Colleges in which each college authorizes the contractor to perform transcript evaluation services. However, this section of the narrative seems to include a textual placeholder that was not filled for the report, and because of this the Off-Site Reaffirmation Committee could locate no evidence or documentation that supports its assertion	<ul> <li>Identify the contractor that performs transcript evaluation services</li> <li>Gather the information we were waiting on from the ACD representatives</li> <li>Align newly gathered information and documentation to previously submitted section narrative</li> </ul>

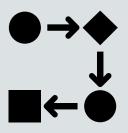

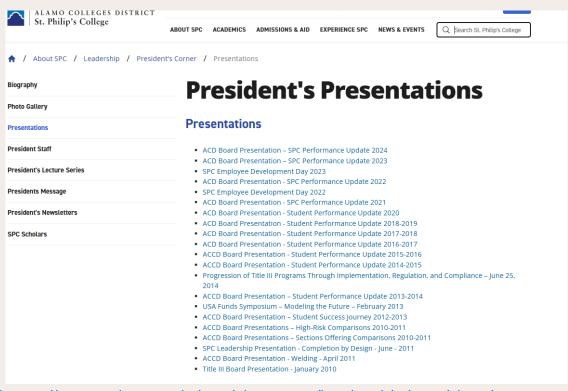
