




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Course Completion Rates – Fall Terms \star

3-Year FTIC Graduation Rates



Degrees & Certificates Awarded by Gender












St. Philip's College: Associates Degrees: 2018-2022










St . Philip's College Associates Degree Wages Post Secondary Employment Outcomes (5 Years Postgraduation)










Fall 2022 Headcount by Zip Code





Fall 2022 Credit Enrollment - County by Major Type










Fall 2022 Credit Enrollment - County by Online Status
